Cattle may only be entered in one class.

Exhibitors must book the number of stalls which they wish to use during the Show and may enter as many animals as they wish on or before the closing date for entries. Exhibitors may not bring to the Show more animals than the number of stalls reserved at the time of entry.

The Compulsory Bovine Viral Diarrhoea Scheme (BVD).

All animals attending the show must have been tested negative for BVD at some point in their lives and evidence of this must accompany entry forms at time of entry.

For cattle born on/after 01/03//2016, only those animal with BVDN status on APHIS (negative BVD result) can be moved into a show herd. APHIS will block the movement of animals which don't have BVDN status.

For cattle born before 01.03.2016, animals with an APHIS status or BVDP (positive), BVDI (inconclusive), DAMPI (dam of a positive animal) or OFPI (offspring of a positive animal) cannot be moved into a show herd. APHIS will block the movement of animals which have any of these statuses.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

SHOW HERD NUMBER: S09001

Livestock Arrivals: Balmoral Park will only be open for the arrival of cattle as follows:

Tuesday 7 December from 4.00pm to 10:00pm
Wednesday 8 December from 10:00am to 7:00pm

ENTRIES

Intending exhibitors are requested to read carefully the following regulations and instructions and only lodge entries if they are prepared to comply strictly with them.

1. Entries may be made on the printed entry form obtained from the RUAS Office or by entering online at www.winterfair.org.uk. Telephone entries are not possible.
2. All entry forms, electronic or otherwise must be completed and signed by the exhibitor or agent and must be lodged with or sent along with correct payment to the Royal Ulster Agricultural Society. Lodgement of entries shall be deemed to be a full acceptance of the Regulations and Instructions.
3. Exhibitors shall familiarise themselves with the various breed society rules which apply to their breed section as they relate to showing, particularly regards eligibility to enter, exhibitor bred status and show ring ethics.
4. Cattle can only be entered in **one** class.
5. No entry will be accepted unless it has been received on or before the closing date – **Friday 19 November 2021 (5.00pm)**. Late entries will not be accepted.
6. All exhibits must be bona fide the property of the exhibitor at the close of entry.
7. No Society staff member is permitted to fill in the entry form for an intending exhibitor.
8. A condition of entry is that all exhibitors names and addresses will be printed in the catalogue.
9. The Council reserves to itself the right to reject any entry without assigning any reason. In the event of the Council being unable to accept an entry, notice will be given not later than 6 days after the final closing of the entries, and the fees lodged will be refunded, or in any case of their being insufficient entries in a class, the Council will withdraw the class from competition and return the entry fees.
10. Each exhibitor or agent must be prepared to verify every statement contained in the entry form in any manner the Council may require

RESPONSIBILITIES OF EXHIBITORS AND THEIR STOCK ATTENDANTS

11. Exhibitors or their stock attendants must be competent and take total responsibility of their stock at all times whilst on the showground. All persons in charge of exhibits will be required to parade or exhibit the animals in their charge at times as directed by the stewards of the show. Stock attendants must be in attendance at least a quarter of an hour before the time appointed for exhibiting the animals under their charge in the Show Ring. No stock attendants shall be allowed to lead more than one animal at a time in the judging ring.
12. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their stock attendants and for the consequences of any misconduct.
13. **Dress.** Exhibitors are requested to ensure that official breed society uniforms are worn by all persons attending their animals in the Show ring.
14. All exhibits and persons in charge of them will be subject to the rules and regulations of the show. The Council delegates full power to the stewards to enforce all the show conditions and regulations.
15. Except in the case of death or personal injury caused by negligence of the show, its servants or agents, the Show will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his or her servant or agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought onto the showground.
16. The Exhibitor shall indemnify the show against, and take full responsibility for all claims, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the showground.
17. Owners of stock are reminded that any act or disobedience or discourtesy to the officials of the show on the part of the owner, or attendant will debar the owner's exhibit or exhibits from adjudication or from taking a prize. The Society's Council reserves the power to remove from the Show, any owner or attendant, together with the exhibit or exhibits concerned. Penalties as laid down in regulation 18 shall apply.
18. Any infringement of any of these regulations or conditions will subject the exhibitor to a fine of £50, and to the forfeiture, by order of the Show, of any prize to which he may be entitled (in addition to all other consequences attaching to such infringement).
19. Please note that CCTV is in operation.

COMPETENCE OF EXHIBITORS

20. All exhibitors must have the physical ability, relevant experience and be competent to handle the animal in their charge at all times. Handlers must be in good health and properly trained in safe work methods.

HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS

21. Exhibitors are reminded that they must conform to the requirements of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and other relevant Health and Safety legislation.
22. Smoking is prohibited in the stock lines and all buildings. Environmental Health Officers and Trading Standard Officers will be in attendance at the show and have the authority to prosecute as appropriate.
23. No oil, gas or electric cooking equipment of any description must be used in the Cattle marquee. Fridges, toasters etc are also not allowed. An exhibitors porta cabin is available with electrical points where food can be heated and anyone found offending, will be dealt with in accordance with Regulation 18.
24. All electrical equipment being used on the Showground must have a current PAT test certificate. All electrical equipment will be checked on arrival and if no PAT test certificate presented the appliance will be tested. Equipment which fails the PAT test will be marked accordingly and must be removed from the premises.
25. All gas appliances coming onto site must be covered by a gas safety cert carried out by a gas safe registered engineer.
26. Fitting may only take place in the allocated areas. Designated preparation stalls must be used. The use of electrical appliances with long leads which traverse the floor of the cattle marquee is prohibited. Extension leads may only be used uncoiled.
27. Livestock exhibitors are reminded that the show environment can be upsetting for livestock, even those of normally placid temperament. Livestock with unstable or aggressive temperament should not be brought to the Showground. Any animal considered to be in a dangerous or infuriated state will not be admitted and should any animal, in the opinion of the stewards, become dangerous in the Showgrounds, it must be removed immediately, or if removal be impracticable or attended with risk, it shall be destroyed.
28. Use of petrol generators is strictly prohibited.

ENTRY WRISTBANDS

29. All exhibitors will receive one admission wrist band, which is not transferable, per two stalls booked subject to a maximum of 4 wrist bands. Wristbands must be worn at all times.

AMALGAMATION/DIVISION OF CLASSES

30. A class with less than 4 entries will, where possible be amalgamated with the nearest similar or relevant class. If there are too many entries in any one class, the class may be divided. Where a class is divided similar prize money will be paid in each division.

STALLING OF LIVESTOCK

31. Exhibitors must ensure that cattle are placed in the stalls allocated to them. The movement of stall positions without the chief cattle steward's consent can lead to disqualification.
32. Stall dimensions – 1.4m x 3m. Stalls must not extend beyond 3m.

ADVERTISING

33. Placards or advertising material will be permitted to be placed over animal's stalls but only in reference to animals exhibited and herd represented. It is not permitted to display rosettes/awards won at previous shows.

FODDER

34. The Show will provide the initial straw bedding for all stock. Exhibitors will be responsible for feeding their own livestock.

MILKING

35. Milking facilities will be available during the Show. Milk produced becomes the property of the Society and no direct payment will be made to exhibitors.

ARRIVAL OF ANIMALS

36. The Showground will only be open for the arrival of cattle as follows:

Tuesday 7 December from 4.00pm to 10:00pm
Wednesday 8 December from 10:00am to 7:00pm

Arrival outside of the above times will result in refusal of admission to the Showgrounds.

37. All cattle must enter the Showground via Gate 1 (Halftown Road). Livestock must not arrive before the stated times.

DEPARTURE OF ANIMALS

38. Cattle will be permitted to leave Balmoral Park after 4.15pm on Thursday 9 December 2021. Cattle should depart via gate F and gate 6 on Bog Road to avoid delays with show traffic.

NOTIFICATION OF CALVING

39. Animals entered in in-milk classes may be transferred to the appropriate in-calf classes if they are uncalved at time of judging. Animals entered in in-calf classes may be transferred to the appropriate in-milk classes if they have calved at time of judging. Exhibitors are responsible for drawing the Society's attention to this requirement where it arises.

ANIMAL WELFARE/ MALPRACTICES

40. The RUAS expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.
41. No artificial device, substance or technique whatever may be adopted for the purpose of interfering with the udders of cattle. No cows or heifers presented in the judging ring may have sealed teats and the RUAS reserves the right to scan the udder of any cow or heifer entered. Any exhibitor found infringing this regulation may be disqualified from exhibiting at the Show.
42. If it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the stewards or show that an exhibitor or competitor has knowingly signed an incorrect certificate, or knowingly given an incorrect pedigree of any animal, or brought forward an animal whose ear number does not correspond to that on the entry form, or has attempted to enter any animal or other exhibit or to obtain a prize by any other unfair means at this or any other Agricultural Society's shows, or is under exclusion from any Breed Society for fraudulent practice, the Show may in its absolute discretion cancel all awards made to such exhibitor or competitor, to disqualify him or her from exhibiting or competing at future Shows of the Company, and to inform other Agricultural Associations of their action in this respect.
43. The Society condemns the use of prohibited or unlicensed drugs in livestock production and reserves the right to take whatever samples it considers necessary for analyses. Should, subsequently a trace of any prohibited or unlicensed drug be found penalties will be applied in line with regulation 28 contained in the regulations and instructions to exhibitors. Furthermore since such positive findings may be in contravention of the Food Safety [Northern Ireland] Order 1991 and its subordinate legislation the results will be reported to the Department of Agriculture Environment and Rural Affairs. All animals entered at the show must remain within the event area during their stay at the show.

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS

44. Where the judges are in doubt, as to age or soundness, or where the Stewards may consider it necessary, the decision of a Veterinary Officer in such cases shall be final and conclusive. Should it be against the animal to which a prize has been awarded, such animals and/or exhibitor shall be disqualified from receiving such prize.
45. Exhibitors shall be liable to pay for all drugs used by the veterinary officers in the treatment of their animals. It is a condition of entry that the veterinary officers may on their own authority give such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his representative cannot be found.

DISEASED ANIMALS

46. Exhibitors are hereby warned against bringing any diseased animal into the Show premises and, if under any circumstances this regulation be violated, the exhibitor of the diseased animal will be solely responsible for any claims that may arise for damage or loss to other exhibitors or any other persons, and the Council holds itself free from liability in such cases. Should any animal manifest symptoms of disease during the Show, it must be removed immediately from the premises, on an order to that effect by the Chief Executive, or by a senior member of the staff, or by a veterinary surgeon appointed by the Society.

RINGWORM

47. Exhibitors are specially cautioned not to send to the show animals which are suffering from ringworm in any stage. Any animal found to be so affected will, on the certificate of the veterinary officers, be disqualified from competition and removed from the Show, and will subject the exhibitor to a fine not exceeding £50 in each case.

OBJECTIONS

48. Any Exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection, having reference to Livestock exhibited at this show, must make the same in writing on a form to be obtained from the RUAS Office, and deposit the sum of £20. Any objection must be made within seven days of the show and will be considered at the next meeting of the Council. If, on investigation, the objection is not sustained the sum thus deposited shall, be forfeited to the funds of the Show. If the objection is sustained the sum lodged will be refunded.
49. The Council reserves the right of determining all disputed cases etc., and the decision of the Council shall be final in all respects

ADJUDICATION OF PRIZES

50. No person shall in any way communicate with a judge engaged in adjudication without the sanction of the steward in attendance. If an attendant infringes this regulation and instruction he shall be removed immediately from the charge of the exhibit, and another attendant substituted by the stewards, at a cost of £20 per hour to the exhibitor. Any exhibitor who enters the space in which adjudication is proceeding may be disqualified from receiving a prize.
51. No marks which might indicate the ownership of stock whilst being exhibited for prizes will be permitted, nor will covers be allowed on animals during show hours without special permission from the stewards

JUDGES

52. If, for any reason, a judge is unable to attend the show or is more than 30 minutes late, the Show reserves the right to appoint a replacement. Every effort will be made to inform exhibitors of the change.
53. The judge shall not award a prize in any of the classes where sufficient merit does not appear.
54. The judge shall not attempt to draw the udders of dry cattle, and if milking cows are to be handled, the judge shall wash and disinfect his/her hands before and after drawing each or any animal
55. The judge will be provided with a book specifying the classes to be adjudicated on, and the number of prizes to be awarded. The judge is particularly requested not to apply for any further information respecting exhibits under their adjudication or examination, except in regard to age
56. The decision of the judges shall in all cases be final, except where misrepresentation or breach of the regulations and instructions is discovered
57. Immediately after judging each class the judge is to sign the Judges book, noting any disqualifications.

PAYMENT OF PRIZES

58. Cheques for the prizes awarded (except where further qualification of an animal is required) will be forwarded by post to the exhibitors to whom they have been awarded as soon as possible after the Show.

PENALTIES

59. In case it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Council that the owner of an animal exhibited, or any person in his employment, or under his control, has been guilty of any violation of the regulations and instructions, had made a false statement in the entry form or substituted another animal for that described in the entry form, has placed an animal in a stall, by day or night, other than that to which he is entitled, or has been guilty of any practice calculated to deceive or mislead, or to secure an unfair advantage, such exhibitor shall forfeit all prizes awarded to him at the Show, together with all fees paid by him, and his animal or animals shall be liable to be removed forthwith from Balmoral Park, and such owner shall be liable to be prevented from competing at this or any further show of the Society.

INTERPRETATION OF REGULATIONS

60. The Show reserves to itself the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations, or prize sheets, and to settle arbitrarily and determine all matters, questions or difference in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the show. Also to refuse and to cancel any entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, vary or cancel awards of prizes or reserve numbers, and relax conditions, as the Show may deem expedient.

BIO SECURITY

61. Gathering animals together from many farms in different areas of the country has the potential to spread animal disease. It is the responsibility of every exhibitor to reduce this risk to a minimum and thus to protect his/her own livestock and that of other farmers. No animal under DAERA restriction, or showing signs or symptoms of any disease, must be brought to a Show.
62. Vehicles used to transport any animals to the Show must be cleansed and disinfected before leaving your farm, with special attention being paid to the underside and wheel arches. Any equipment brought to the Show should also be cleansed and disinfected with a DAERA approved disinfectant.
63. Clean protective clothing and footwear should be worn when handling animals.
64. If bedding is to be used at the Show, it should be fresh and clean. Contaminated bedding should not be removed from the transport vehicle at the Show grounds.
65. Contact between animals while at the Show should be kept to a minimum.
66. Prior to leaving the Showgrounds, or immediately on return home, protective clothing and footwear should be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected. Vehicles used to transport animals should be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected with special attention being paid to the underside and wheel arches.
67. Any clinical signs of disease occurring in animals that have been at the Show, during the following two to three weeks, must be reported to the Show operators. In the case of notifiable diseases, your local DAERA office should also be notified

Procedure for Movement of Northern Ireland (NI) Cattle into and out of Local Agricultural Shows

IMPORTANT NOTE:

Only animals free from disease restrictions, including Tuberculosis, Brucellosis, Bluetongue and Bovine Viral Diarrhoea (herd or individual animal restrictions) may be permitted to move to a Show.

Procedures for movement of cattle are listed in the Show Guidance for exhibitors. A copy can be downloaded from the DAERA website.

Movement to the Show and Testing of Animals: - Only animals free from disease restrictions, including Tuberculosis, Brucellosis, BVD and Bluetongue (herd or individual animal restrictions) may be permitted to the Show.

Pre-movement testing for Bovine Brucellosis is no longer required for movement to shows. Testing for Bovine Viral Diarrhoea is required. This must accompany entry forms at time entry. (see below).

To minimize the risk of other livestock, exhibitors are encouraged to have Show animals tested for Tuberculosis by their Private Veterinary Practitioner in the 30 days beforehand.

To minimise the risk to their own herd, exhibitors are encouraged to quarantine show animals and have them tested for Tuberculosis by their Private Veterinary Practitioner at least 42 days after their last appearance at a show and before re-integration to the main herd.

Procedures for movement of cattle are listed in the Show Guidance for exhibitors. A copy can be downloaded from the DAERA website.

Identification

All cattle must be properly identified and comply with the Cattle Identification Regulations.

General Principles

- Cattle going to a Show(s) must be accompanied by a fully completed MC2 document identifying the Show premises as the destination.
- Cattle moving from a Show must return to the herd they came from.

The number of Shows to which cattle may travel is not limited provided these conditions are met on all occasions.

Movements to or from a Show

Movements to a Show

Pre-movement testing for Bovine Brucellosis is no longer required for movement to shows.

On arrival at the Show, the cattle must be accompanied by a fully completed MC2 document.

The top 3 copies (MC2A-White, MC2B-Yellow and MC2C-Pink) must be brought to the Show. All 3 copies will be checked by a Show Representative and stamped with the Show stamp.

The MC2A (white) will be retained by the Show Operative.

Movements from a Show (including Show Operator's Responsibilities)

1. Where the exhibitor has their Sticker Book with them the Show will issue a movement out MC2 endorsed with the herd number of the exhibitor and the serial number of the 'move in' MC2. The MC2A (White) and MC2B (Yellow) 'move out' copies should be stapled to the Yellow 'move in' copy and have a yellow confirmation sticker applied. This must then be sent by the Show Operatives to be received at the local DAERA Direct Office at the latest by the next working day. The MC2C (Pink) 'move out' copy should be stapled to the Pink 'move in' copy and have the corresponding pink sticker applied. This must be given to the herd keeper for his/her own records (see Annex A).
2. Where the exhibitor does not have their sticker book with them the Show will issue a 'move out' MC2 with ALL details completed (including animal details). The move out MC2A (White) copy with the move in MC2B (yellow copy) must be sent to the local DAERA Direct Office at the latest by the next working day and the move out MC2B (Yellow) and MC2C (Pink) copies with the move in MC2C (pink) copy must be given to the exhibitor. The herd keeper must return the MC2B, with a yellow sticker attached and must be received by his/her local DAERA Direct Office within **7 days** (to avoid an NMN status) and the MC2C, with corresponding pink sticker attached, must be kept for his/her records (see Annex B).

Procedure for Movement of Cattle from the Republic of Ireland (RoI) into and out of Shows

Note - In order to receive cattle from the RoI, the Show premises must be operating to full EU Assembly Centre Standards for cattle and be approved for this purpose. As part of these requirements RoI cattle must be kept segregated from NI cattle and must be re-exported directly from the Show premises to their premises of origin in the RoI as soon as the Show ends.

Cattle imported directly to a Show

Note - animals must be registered on APHIS by DAERA staff before they can move into a Show. This registration process will be carried out by the local DAERA office on receipt of the Health certificate, passport and "Show" MC2 documents from the Show Organiser. The registration process will allow DAERA to produce the necessary paperwork for the move out of the show. At present it is not possible for Show Organisers to electronically move imported animals into a show.

Cattle entering a Show will be accompanied by a Passport and a Health Certificate.

The Show will be issued with its own MC2 self-written notification book.

The Show Operative will enter the animal(s) details onto the MC2 then send the completed MC2A (White) MC2B (Yellow) and MC2C (Pink) documents to the local DAERA Direct Office at the latest by the next working day.

MC2D (Blue) should be retained in MC2 book.

Cattle Re-exported Directly from a Show.

Cattle being re-exported to RoI will need to be accompanied by:

- An MC2L (produced by the local DAERA Direct Office);
- The passport (which accompanied the animal to the Show);
- Their original Health Certification suitably endorsed by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show;
- A Non Co-minglement Certificate which will be issued by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.
